

Year nine students attended a History workshop at the end of last term in Durham. It was very successful and incorporated a significant amount of French as well as History. Students had to work alongside students from other schools to create their own enquiry into the Christmas Truce of the First World War. It was specifically designed to stretch the brightest students and create a passion for the subjects. Students investigated different source material to develop their critical and inference skills, both of which our super students demonstrated brilliantly.





A trip to the Side Gallery in Newcastle proved very enriching for our Photography students. The exhibition, EUROVISIONS; 1989 All That Falls, has strong links to Art, History, and Political studies as the exhibition centres on the events around the Fall of the Berlin Wall. Many students were shocked to discover that a photographic image could be used as a powerful tool for good and ill as one of the photographers in the exhibition had been jailed for taking a photo of a Communist party member asleep in a meeting. Other images record the euphoria that overtook both officials and civilians as the Berlin Wall was brought down. The images on display were mostly black and white and our students responded by taking their own atmospheric images around the Newcastle Quayside area, exploring black and white techniques as seen above.
