It makes it easier to talk about long periods of time, not just individual days, months or years but whole centuries!!

Task: Do a timeline about <u>YOU</u>!


A timeline in <u>history</u> tells a story. Tell us the story of your life in a timeline.

- Things you could include:
- ✓Your date of birth
- ✓ When you got your first pet
- ✓ When you went on holiday

- ✓ First day at school
- \checkmark Birth of a brother or sister
- First time you started doing a hobby e.g. gymnastics, singing, football, brownies, ice hockey, drama,
- ✓ Special occasions at school e.g. assemblies, sports days, school trips
