WE PROVIDE EXCEPTIONAL CARE THROUGH OUR HOLISTIC PASTORAL PROVISION

Our Sixth Form delivers high quality education in a safe and supportive environment. We are an inclusive community where everyone is welcome.

Sixth Form students are led by a strong, experienced pastoral team. They offer exceptional care to all students whilst actively promoting their social, moral, spiritual and cultural development.

Every Sixth Form student belongs to a small form class. The form tutor meets daily with their form class to offer support and guidance to every student. Students' pastoral and academic progress is monitored closely through one to one meetings held regularly with their tutor.

Success is celebrated weekly in an assembly led by the Head of Year. The Head of Year and Assistant Head of Year remains with the year group throughout their two years of study. Situated within the heart of the Sixth Form block, they are readily available for students and parents should the need arise. These roles are supported by the Assistant Headteacher-Post 16, who has overall responsibility for pastoral care and academic progress.

As in our main school, pastoral work is complemented by our extended support team including Learning Mentors, School Counsellor and School Chaplain. Where appropriate, the SEN Department will be involved to support teaching and learning.

WE PREPARE OUR STUDENTS FOR A SUCCESSFUL FUTURE

At St Thomas More we have a proven track record of excellent outcomes at Key Stage 5. Our Sixth Form examination results are consistently among the strongest in North Tyneside.

Since 2009, our Level 3 pass rate remains at an excellent 99 -100% at Grade A*-E, and our retention figures from Year 12 into Year 13 are also impressively high.

Each year our students achieve around 90% A*-C grades or equivalent, with a large number of students achieving A*/A grades. Excellent attainment ensures high levels of progression each year to university, employment or training.

We have strong links with local Universities and all students will attend a Study Skills day or Open Day to help prepare them for the rigours of undergraduate study. Most St Thomas More students advance to their first choice provider with many choosing Oxbridge and Russell Group universities. An established and highly effective UCAS application process is available to all Year 13 students, with each assigned a mentor. They greatly benefit from individualised support when writing their personal statements and with choosing appropriate, aspirational courses.

Those who wish to seek an alternative pathway are enrolled onto our Employability Group. This weekly tuition programme, led by our Assistant Head of Year, is devoted specifically to preparing students for employment, training and apprenticeships. Talks from local industry experts, work experience opportunities and an annual Careers Day ensure they are given the best opportunity to succeed when they leave us.

With high expectations and aspirations for all we are confident that our students will leave St Thomas More well prepared to take their next steps.
